


### Children's Books



#### Bullies and Gangs


\*\*Join four young friends as they talk about how they cope with bullies and being bullied.

#### The Last Day of Slavery



\*\*Can one good deed from an ordinary girl change the world? It's a feel good story that inspires and celebrates a world of full of ordinary deeds!


## Riding the Tiger






## Ten Canadians Who made a Difference


## Character Education: Teaching Values for Life


